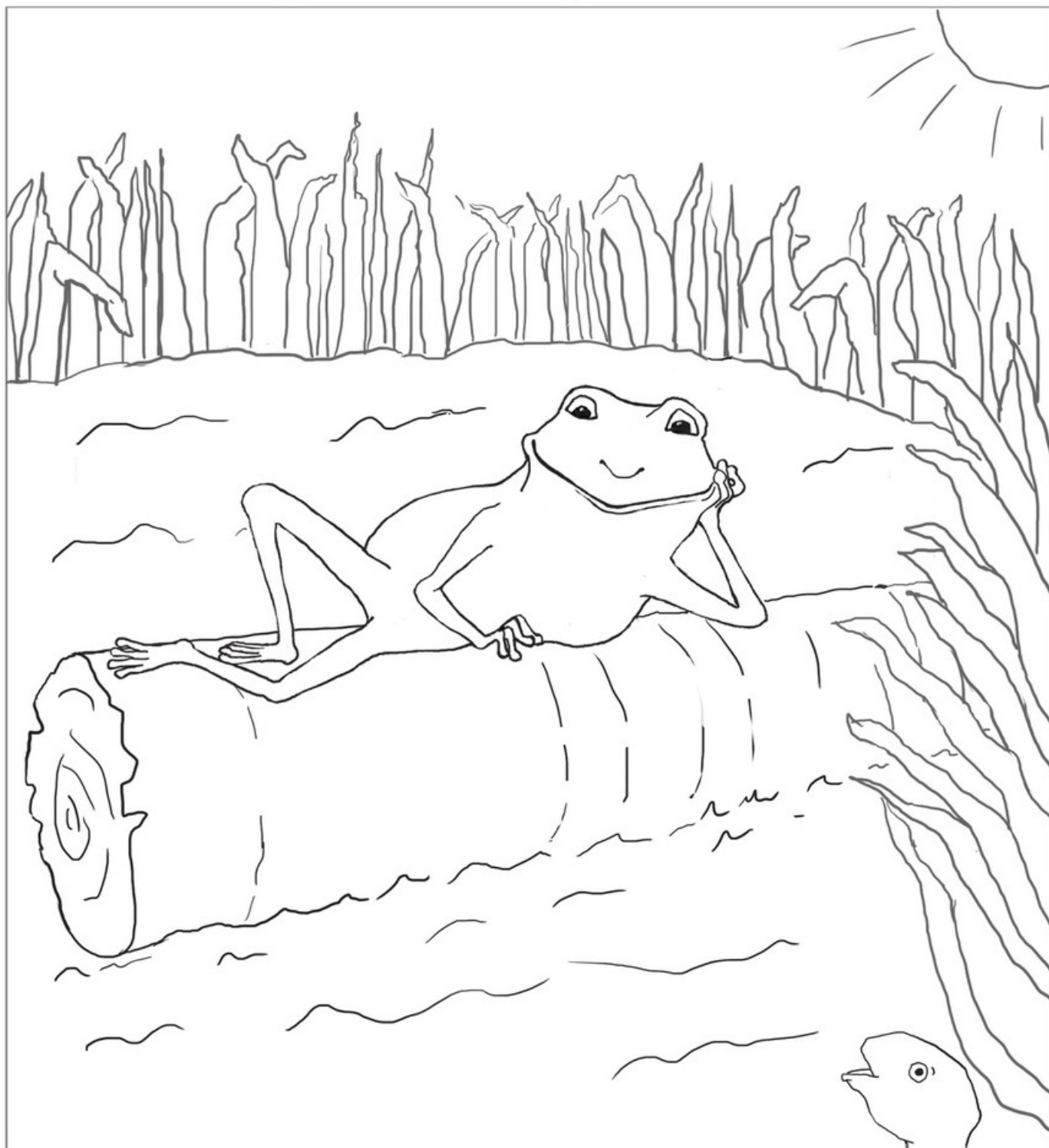

FROG ON A LOG IN A POND

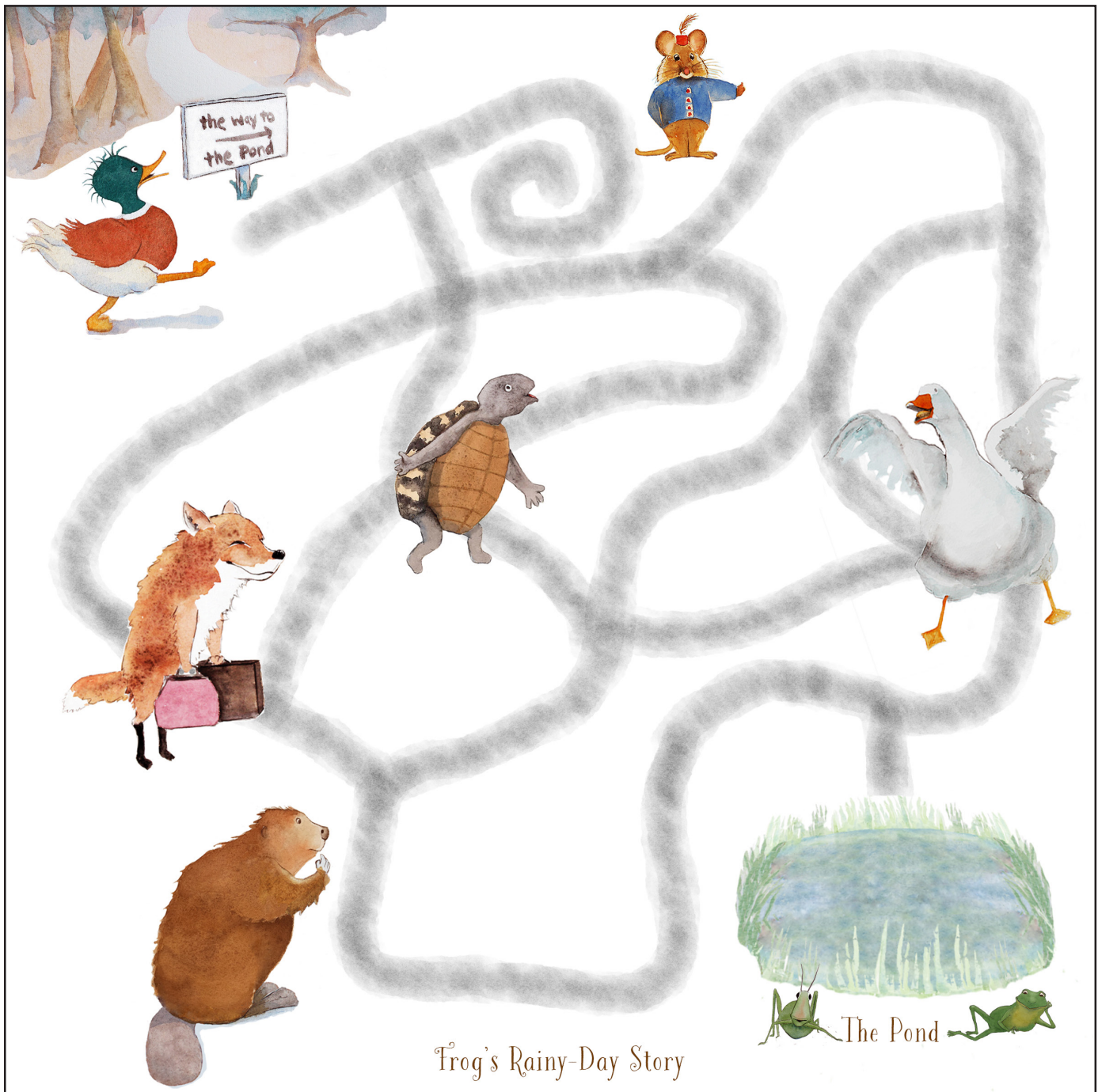


How will you color Frog? Can you find Turtle?

If he leaves Duck, Fox, and the grain behind,

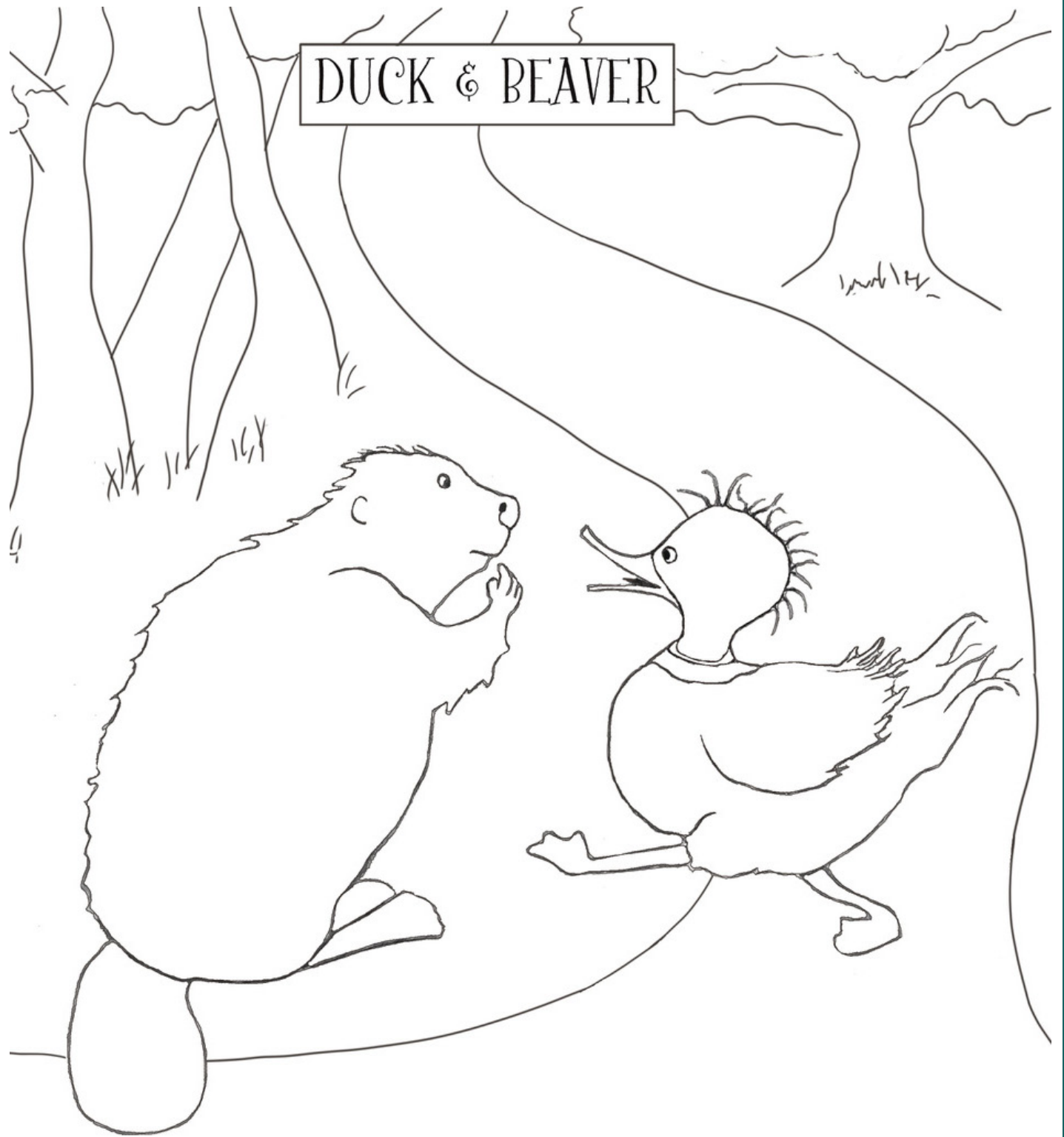
Duck will eat the grain, and Fox will chase away Duck.

(The boat is too small to take more than one thing.)



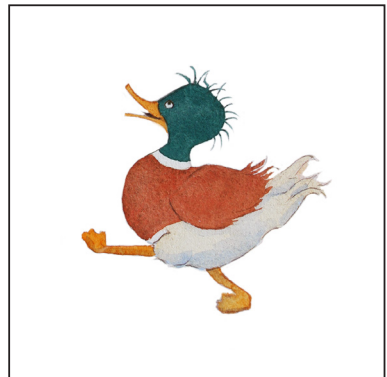
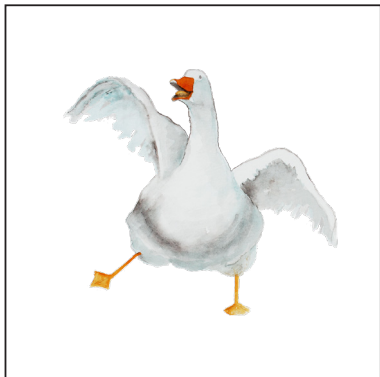
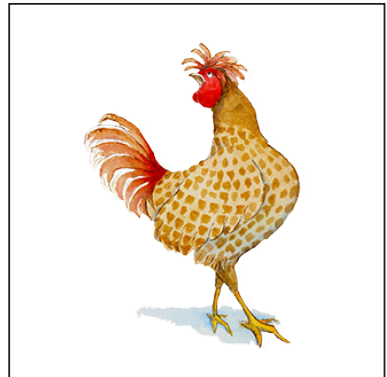
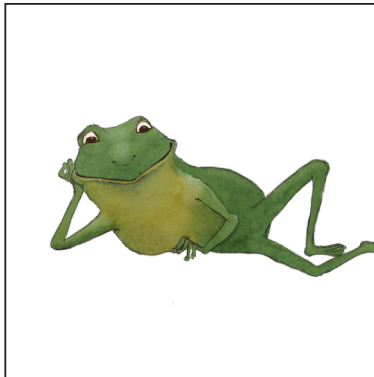
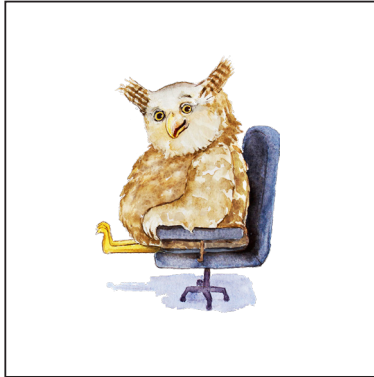

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- In John 7:5 we read that when Jesus was carrying out his ministry on earth, his own brothers did not believe in him (John 7:5). What do you think it would be like to realize that the brother you grew up with was in fact the God who created everything, including you! (Colossians 1:15-20)

Read Luke 9:46 – 47:

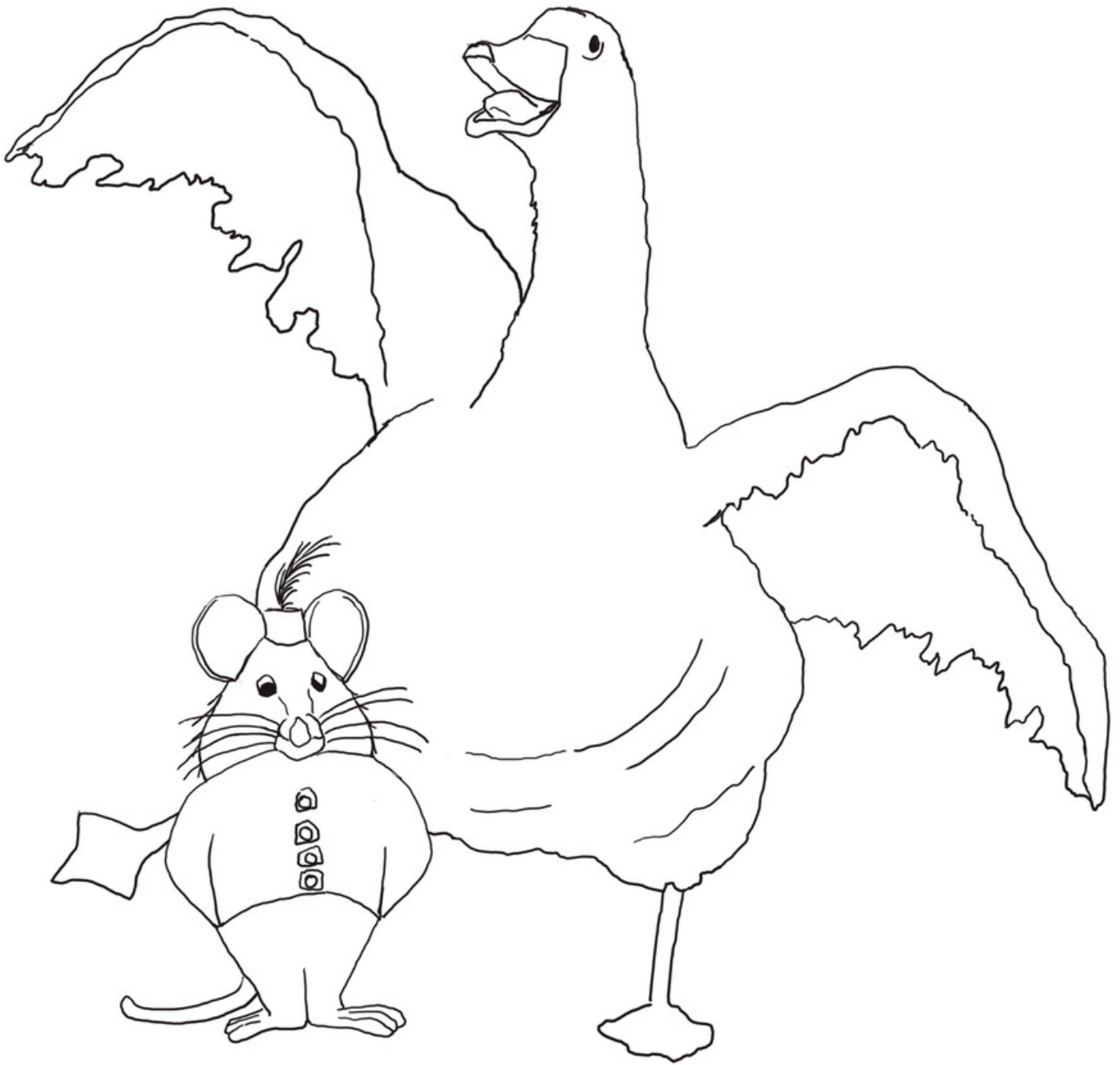
- Compare the actions of the disciples in this passage to the actions of the letters in the fable.

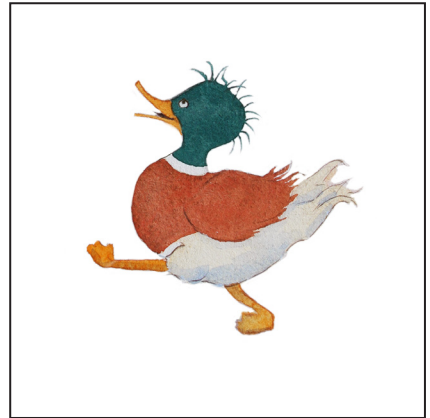
